



Relicensing Brief: RECREATION

- Georgia Power recreation lands on Lake Jackson offer diverse opportunities for recreation including picnicking, swimming, boating, and bank fishing.
- Georgia Power owns and operates four public access points on the shoreline around Lake Jackson:

Access Point	Amenities
Lloyd Shoals Park	Picnic/day use area; swimming beach; playground; picnic pavilion; barrier-free fishing pier; restrooms; barrier-free boat ramp
Jane Lofton Public Access Area	Bank fishing
Lloyd Shoals Tailrace Fishing Pier	Barrier-free fishing pier
Ocmulgee River Park	Boat ramp; picnic/day use area; bank fishing

- There are four other commercially-operated access points around the lake that include three restaurants/marinas and one stand-alone marina.
- Besides the Georgia Power and four commercial locations there are other recreational opportunities in the area which include:
 - Factory Shoals Park – 450 acres, picnicking, swimming, hiking, fishing
 - Future Farmers of America (FFA)/Family, Career, and Community Leaders of America (FCCLA) Georgia Center – canoeing & kayaking, swimming

Bottom Line Take Away: Georgia Power’s facilities and other commercially-operated access areas around the lake provide abundant recreational opportunities.
