**Monday, April 17, 2006**

**The Wildlife & Botanical; Wetlands, Riparian & Littoral Habitat; Rare, Threatened and Endangered Species; and Fisheries Reports** were presented.

There were technical questions and answers about the studies.

There were no requests for additional studies on the resource studies presented.

**Tuesday, April 18, 2006**

**The Water Resources Report** was presented.

There were technical questions and answers about the Water Resources study.

There were no requests for additional studies on water resources.

**The Geology and Soils Report** was presented.

There were technical questions and answers about the Geology and Soils study.

In regard to requests for additional studies or additional information, NPS indicated it may request additional studies based upon NPS's own study of shoal bass genetics in Big Creek. FWS and UCR indicated that they may request additional studies based upon a sediment study that those stakeholders are presently conducting; however, they do not have their results yet. FERC indicated that such requests must be filed by May 30, 2006.

**Wednesday, April 19, 2006**

The **Recreation and Land Use Report** was presented.

There were technical questions and answers about the Recreation and Land Use Study.

There was the following area of agreement in response to a request from FERC:

- Table 3 in the Recreation & Land Use Report will be edited to show recreational areas which are within the project boundary.

There were no requests for additional studies on recreation and land use.

The **Cultural Resources: Archaeological and Historical Study Report** was presented.

There were technical questions and answers about the Cultural Resources: Archaeological and Historical Study.

Georgia Power provided the following response to a question from FERC regarding the timing of the Historic Properties Management Plan:

- GPC will attempt to submit an HPMP with the license application.

There were no requests for additional studies on cultural resources.
