AVAILABILITY:

Throughout the Company's service area from existing lines of adequate capacity. The FlatBill Select Pilot (FBS Pilot) contract is for 12 months and may be extended for an additional year at the discretion of the Company.

APPLICABILITY:

Applicable to small and medium commercial customers who have been in their current facility for at least 12 months, have had their electricity priced on the General Service (GS), Power and Light Small (PLS), Power and Light Medium (PLM), School Load Management (SLM) or School Service (SCH) tariffs over the previous 12 months, have a billing demand of less than 500 kW and are currently in good financial standing with Georgia Power. This tariff can not be used as a base rate in the customer base load portion of the Real Time Pricing (RTP) tariffs or in conjunction with the Demand Plus Energy Credit (DPEC) or Daily Energy Credit (DEC) riders. Customers being billed under the unmetered portion of GS or PLS do not qualify for FlatBill Select.

All customers must have separately metered facilities.

Service shall not be resold or shared with others.

TYPE OF SERVICE:

Single or three phase, 60 hertz, at a standard voltage.

TERM OF CONTRACT:

Service hereunder shall be for a period of one year. There is no true-up in customers' bills at the end of the contract period. If extended, all eligible FBS Pilot customers' offers will be updated based upon their previous year's consumption, and they will be notified of their new FlatBill Select offer options.

A customer who withdraws from FBS Pilot prior to the end of the 12 month contract period may be required to pay an additional amount. Specifically, if the amount of electricity such customers actually used results in a billing amount under the GS, PLS, PLM, SLM or SCH tariffs that is greater than the amount for which they have been billed under the FBS Pilot tariff such customers must pay that difference. Customers will not receive any refund or credit for amounts paid under the FlatBill tariff if the amount of electricity actually used results in a billing amount under the GS, PLS, PLM, SLM or SCH tariffs that is less than the amount for which such customers have been billed.

If a customer's monthly peak demand is 50% or higher than the peak demand in the previous year then the Company may return the customer back to the standard tariff for the remaining months of the FBS Pilot contract. The return to the standard tariff will operate under the same provision concerning customer withdrawals as stated above.

BILL FORMULA:

Monthly Bill = FBS Pilot Monthly Amount + Excess Energy Charge (when applicable)

FBS Pilot Monthly Amount = \sum [(expected monthly kWh and kW at standard tariff + Monthly Excess kVar charges)(1 + risk premium %) + Monthly Base Charge + Environmental Compliance Cost Recovery + Franchise Fees] / 12

Minimum Monthly Bill = FBS Pilot Monthly Amount

Ceiling Menu Options

Monthly bill amounts will be constant across all months unless customers exceed their chosen kWh ceiling amounts.

A. Number of Ceiling Periods Per Year (Chosen by the Company):

For the purpose of this Pilot, the Company will at its discretion offer one of the following options to customers based on their previous usage history:

Seasonal Option	3 ceiling periods per year (summer, winter, shoulder): One constant monthly kWh amount for each month of the designated periods but may be different across periods
Monthly Option	12 ceiling periods per year (January through December): A separate kWh ceiling amount for each month

B. Ceiling Options (kWh) (Chosen by the Customer):

Customers must select one of the following options:

Low Option	Expected consumption multiplied by a low multiplier
Moderate Option	Expected consumption multiplied by a moderate multiplier
High Option	Expected consumption multiplied by a high multiplier

NOTE: These multipliers for each option are specific but uniform for all customers on the same tariff.

DEFINITIONS:

Expected Monthly kWh and kW (if applicable) - Customer's expected monthly energy consumption is calculated based on the customer's historical metered usage adjusted for normal weather and consumption changes in customer behavior.

Standard tariff charges – Charges from the appropriate otherwise applicable rate schedule, fuel charges and other applicable riders.

Risk Adder % - The adder is used to compensate Georgia Power for the risk associated with weather-related consumption as well as the risk associated with non-weather impacts. This adder may be different based on the customer's previous tariff and will not exceed 10%.

Base Charges – Expected base charges from the appropriate rate schedule including Environmental Compliance Cost Recovery (ECCR) charges and other applicable riders and schedules.

Excess Energy Charges – When applicable, computed on usage above a pre-determined kWh monthly ceiling at a rate of \$0.30/kWh in the billing months of June through September and \$0.10/kWh during the remainder of the year.

Normal Weather - Based on Georgia's heating degree-days and cooling degree-days for a normal weather year.

Summer Ceiling Period - Billing months of June through September.

Winter Ceiling Period - Billing months of December through March.

Shoulder Ceiling Period - Billing months of April, May, October and November.

FBS PILOT BILL OFFER CALCULATION:

Steps:

1. Determine the customer's expected 12 months of usage adjusted for normal weather.
2. Apply the appropriate tariff and riders (including ECCR and FCR and excluding base charges) to expected usage in each month.
3. Apply the Risk Adder to step 2.
4. Apply the appropriate base charges (including ECCR) in each month.
5. Apply the appropriate Franchise Fees in each month.
6. Calculate the annual bill by summing all of the monthly charges.
7. Calculate the FBS Pilot monthly amount by dividing the annual bill by 12.

FBS PILOT BILL DETERMINATION:

1. If applicable, determine customer's usage above pre-determined kWh ceiling.
2. If applicable, apply Excess Energy Charges, Environmental Compliance Cost Recovery and Franchise Fees.
3. If applicable, calculate revised monthly bill in those months where previous months' usage exceeds the pre-determined ceiling by adding Excess Energy Charges, Environmental Compliance Cost Recovery and Franchise Fees to the FBS Pilot bill in step 7 above.

Note: Sales taxes are not included in the FBS Pilot offer but will be included in FBS Pilot Bill.

ENVIRONMENTAL COMPLIANCE COST RECOVERY:

The monthly amount calculated in the above rate includes the provisions of the Company's effective Environmental Compliance Cost Recovery Schedule, including any applicable adjustments.

FUEL COST RECOVERY:

The monthly amount calculated in the above rate includes the provisions of the Company's effective Fuel Cost Recovery Schedule.

FRANCHISE FEE:

The monthly amount calculated in the above rate includes the provisions of the Company's effective Franchise Fee Schedule, including any applicable adjustments.

GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS:

The bill calculated under this tariff is subject to change in such an amount as may be approved and/or amended by the Georgia Public Service Commission under the provisions of applicable riders and other schedules.
