Boatslips/Boatlifts/PWC Lifts




Boatlifts and PWC lifts are specifically intended for private, single family residential shoreline structures and may not be placed on multi-family, common, group use or commercial docks.

BOATSLIPS

Lake Oconee permits only a single boatslip configuration of 16' wide $\times 32'$ deep off a private residence dock.

Boatslip walkways cannot be greater than 6' wide on main walkway and no greater than 4' wide on the outside slip walkway — slip width/depth is directly influenced by walkway width.

BOATLIFTS

Lake Oconee is the only Georgia Power lake that permits free-standing boatlifts.

Georgia Power may permit a total of two boatlifts on single resident private dock.

If a structure can house two boatlifts, one must be placed inside of boatslip.

Boatlifts are considered an extension of dock and must be 15' off projected side property lines, measured from edge of lift to property line projection both onshore and extended outward into lake. This is at Georgia Power's sole discretion and cannot be expected to apply in every circumstance.

A maximum of two boatlift canopies are allowed per shoreline structure. Canopies must be canvas, vinyl or a similar soft-sided material.

Canopies can be no higher than 9' above deck height of dock and sides cannot extend down more than 3' from top of canopy frame.



Boatslips/Boatlifts/PWC Lifts



PWC LIFTS

PWC lifts must be located inside the building envelope of the structure (i.e. behind dock, boatslip) and may not be separate from the dock/boatslip.

If a shoreline structure has two boatlifts, a total of 4 PWC lifts may be allowed so long as they can be located within the building envelope (behind dock, boatslip) of structure.

PWC lifts may not be covered with a canopy if boatlifts are already covered.
