

Ash Pond Closures Update - December 2018

The company has made progress to safely and permanently close 29 ash ponds at 11 current and former coal-fired power plants across the state. Georgia Power remains committed to removing all coal ash from 19 ash ponds located adjacent to lakes or rivers and using advanced engineering methods and technologies to close the remaining 10 ash ponds in place. As of December 2018, Georgia Power has completed closure construction activities and removed all ash from five ash ponds at Plants Branch, Kraft, McDonough and Yates. Additionally, construction activities are currently underway at multiple sites with closure construction efforts expected to be completed at six additional ash ponds at Plants McDonough, McManus, Hammond and Yates this year.
