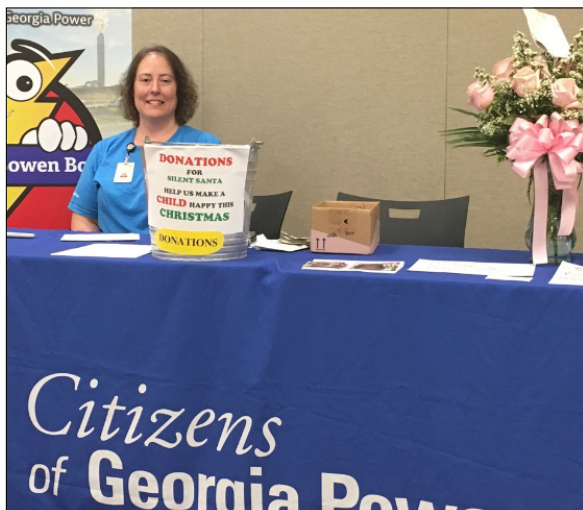

Plant Bowen Citizens members made sure some local kids will be extra scary for Halloween by donating costumes that will be delivered to local shelters.

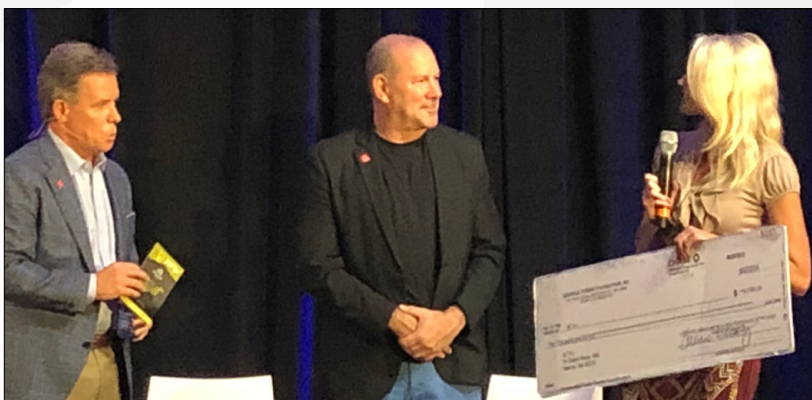


Carrollton Chapter

\$8,200. The money was raised by the chapter's successful clay shoot. The Atlanta Children's Shelter provides free, quality day care for homeless families.

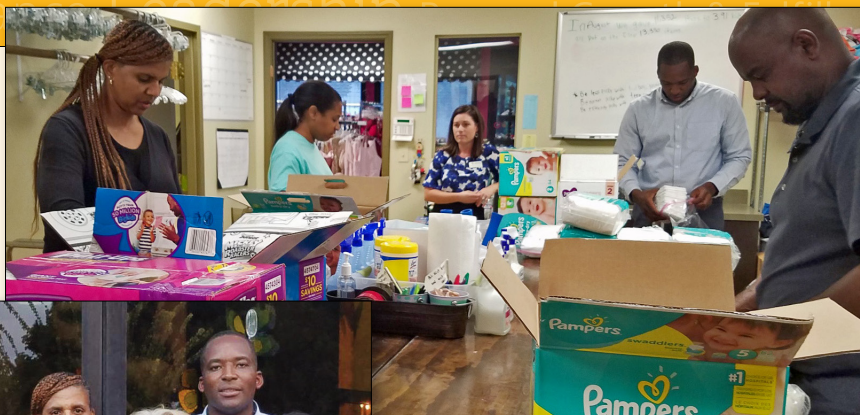




Athens Chapter
