in Macon on Saturday, November 9th. I look forward to celebrating all the successes you've had across the state this year. While there are too many to mention them all at the meeting, I am so proud of the impact all our chapters have made across the state this year.

One other way that Citizens makes an impact is with our three registered charities. The Georgia Power Family House, Inc. is one of those charities and it makes a big difference in the lives of our coworkers and their families in times of medical need. The charity was created to provide convenient, inexpensive, temporary lodging for employees and their families who must travel from other parts of the state for medical treatment in the Atlanta area. Citizens sponsors, manages and operates two different facilities: The Peggy M. Grubb House and the John and June Hemby House.

The Hemby House opened in 2011 and is a 2-bedroom condo convenient to downtown hospitals, as well as Emory. The Peggy M. Grubb house opened in 1986 and is a mile away from Northside, St. Joseph's, and Children's Healthcare. The Peggy M. Grubb house will soon move to another location and will boast improved facilities. The current house has six bedrooms and four shared bathrooms along with shared common spaces.

These homes are available overnight (or for an extended stay) for the families of Georgia Power and Southern Company employees, retirees or their immediate families. The space is on a first come basis. There is no fee required but donations are graciously accepted. If you know of an employee who is needing to travel to Atlanta for medical purposes and needs lodging, please refer them to the Family House and ask them to call 404-506-2828 to check availability and for reservations. Our wonderful Volunteer Service staff is on call 24/7 to assist.

We always see our Citizens chapters surround communities and individuals in times of need. The Georgia Power Family House is just one more way Citizens helps lessen the burden for individuals at a time when they should be focusing on getting well, not

on finding or affording lodging for medical treatment. I am proud to be part of an organization that helps our coworkers in times of need, and I hope you are as well. It is good to know that if you ever need it, the Family House will be there.
