


Heart of Georgia



The school is comprised of 460 students; 62% Black or African American, 34% Hispanic, 2% Multi-Racial, and 1% White. The school building is the oldest building in the district and is scheduled to be replaced if property can be secured. 20 volunteers revamped, including cleaning, organizing, and painting, a classroom and outdoor space to provide students an opportunity for a fun experience in school while being celebrated for meeting academic goals, taking a mental break, or during recess time.













Plant Yates
