

Carrollton




Drew Hammett and his son joined in the Arbor Day festivities and planted a tree at their farm near Waleska.

Sapelo Island Legacy Project

The Whole Story

THE WHY:

If you ever had the pleasure of meeting Robert Stokes, you know how much of a light he was to his team, his friends, and his community. Robert was the embodiment of being A Citizen Wherever You Serve. Sapelo Island is a coastal barrier island with a rich history. The Hog Hammock community on Sapelo Island is the last intact island-based Gullah-Geechee community in America. In 2016 there were a total of 37 full time residents on Sapelo Island of which every single one had a personal relationship with Robert and knew him by name. At that time anyone visiting Sapelo Island and wearing a Georgia Power Logo would be asked "Did you know Robert?" And of course, if you were in "his" area, you knew Robert and Robert knew you. He was a very special friend and leader.

In 2018, The Brunswick Chapter started learning more about Legacy Projects and how to use funds to impact communities. At that time we became aware of the growing number of children living full time on the island who had no real place to play. At the existing playground stood a 50+-year-old metal slide, a few swings on a rusted-out frame and rotten wooden picnic tables. We saw a community with little funding and minimal resources where our funds and labor could make a huge impact and of course, it would be for the Legacy of Mr. Robert Stokes.







THE WHO & THE HOW:

The Brunswick Chapter of The Citizens of Georgia Power knew that the scope of this project would exceed the \$10k grant from The Georgia Power Foundation and we recognized the impact Robert had on the community, Georgia Power, and anyone who knew him. The significance of this project needed to reflect his legacy. We decided to include other chapters of which Robert had been a member and reached out to Statesboro (Austin Bell-President), Savannah (Jimmy Brown-President), and Valdosta (Jack SchroepferPresident) to ask them to join us in requesting Legacy Funds from the foundation for our project. They agreed to partner with us, and collectively we were able to make a \$40,000 contribution to remove trees and build a playground and full-size basketball court for the families at Sapelo Island.

THE WHEN:

The Brunswick Chapter started talking about this project in late 2019 knowing it would be a huge undertaking since Sapelo Island is only accessible by boat. Planning to determine needs, resources, and community impact began and then COVID emerged in early 2020. In 2021 each of the four partner chapters were able to secure a \$10k grant from the foundation. Because we were unable to gather in numbers and due to logistics constraints brought on by COVID, our project was put on hold. Even still, we continued communicating with our Sapelo Island partners to formulate a plan. On Friday, March 25, 2022, nine of our teammates met for the demolition of the existing playground equipment and prepared the grounds for installation. Shortly after that, our partners on Sapelo Island (Department of Natural Resources, Sapelo Island Cultural and Revitalization Society and Hog Hammock Community) were able to have the concrete poured for the new basketball court and install the basketball goals. Finally, in November of 2022, the playground equipment arrived, and we began to really start planning the installation. Our Sapelo Island Partners (DNR, SICARS, HHC) and residents helped with the concrete work so everything would be set before the big workday. On Thursday, February 23rd a total of 27 Georgia Power Citizens and Ambassadors were able to complete the installation of the playground and basketball court. On Saturday, February 25th, in conjunction with Sapelo Island's Black History Day Celebration, a dedication will be held to commemorate our work and Robert's legacy. This will mark the official opening of the playground.
