Making a Difference Everyday

Chattahoochee Hydro employee and Carrollton and Columbus Citizens member Tony Edmondson has been giving back and serving his community for years. His efforts are contagious, and he continues to enlist co-workers, friends, and neighbors. Together they lift others and make their community better. Recently Tony and his crew were made aware of a situation where a gentleman was living in less-than-ideal conditions in a campground. I'll let Tony take it from here:

"A friend of mine lives in this campground... His stepdaughter temporarily lived there because her house flooded. They met this man just by being friendly and noticed they never saw him outside so my buddy Mark Whitley had some extra food one day went to offer him some of his leftovers, this was the beginning. One Sunday he was going to have extra and so was his stepdaughter. Mark took over a plate of food and later Haley the stepdaughter did so as well, she came back crying and said Mr. Bruce said he couldn't take the food because his refrigerator wasn't working and didn't have a place to keep extra. They immediately went and bought him a small refrigerator that night, then they find out the AC wasn't working in August and we all know how hot August was also the ceiling was falling in the bathroom so that Sunday night Mark called me and explained the situation ,as he was talking ,I was typing on Facebook to get the word out about this man's living conditions and hoping we could make something happen fast, and it did. The next day an offer came in about a camper, we met and went to look at it. It was a no go, but just a few hours later another came in and it was perfect. Now the money started to come in and the 2nd camper was sold to us for \$2,500. valued at about \$8,000-10,000. Arrangements were made for the camper to be delivered and give it to Mr. Bruce and a fish fry followed that afternoon. Over \$5,000 dollars was donated in 6 days. This past Saturday we built the deck so he would have an easier way in and out. Money is still coming in and we have a reserve of about \$1,500 now, I think. Through discounts at Home Depot in LaGrange, and the generosity of the community we were able to make this happen fast."







Hurricane Idalia

We have all heard the comments that Georgia Power is like family and glad to be a part of the Georgia Power family. No time that I can think of where that has been more evident than with Hurricane Idalia. Husbands and wives went to work for days leaving spouses to hold down the fort at home. Those spouses support and presence is the essence of Georgia Power family. Environmental Affairs Manager Joe Brownlee said it better than I ever could:

"As the sun came up the morning after Idalia came through Valdosta, DAT teams were spreading out across the town. Elizabeth Brownlee saw her dad with his hard hat and vest and demanded to be a part of the recovery! Later that day she and her mom Mary Beth ran into Kim Greene at the Governor's press conference where they were working with other volunteers throughout the region. For so many Georgia Power Employees this truly was a family affair."
