  Turbidity and total residual chlorine are monitored continuously. The value reported is the weekly maximum and the daily average is the average of the weekly maximum values reported.

  Calculated Receiving Water Concentrations shows the effluent concentration at the discharge once it has fully mixed on the receiving waterbody. This value is calculated as a dissolved concentration for an appropriate comparison to the numeric water quality criteria, which are also in the dissolved form. Consistent with Georgia EPD, non-detectable effluent concentrations are not translated into Calculated Receiving Water Concentrations.

  Numeric Water Quality Criteria is the maximum concentration of a parameter (calculated at a default hardness of 50 mg/L as calcium carbonate) established for the receiving waterbody that will be protective of the designated use per Georgia EPD's rules and regulations. Calculated Receiving Water Concentrations have the waterbody.

  Acute (short-term) water quality criterion to be compared with the weekly calculated. Acute (short-term) water quality criterion to be compared with the average calculated receiving water concentration.
