

Underground Residential Distribution (URD) Fee Increase on July 1, 2020

Things to Know

Rate Case Outcome

The underground residential distribution (URD) fee is increasing from the current \$725 to \$1,000 per residential service point as part of our 2019 Rate Case Filing that went into effect January 1, 2020.

To allow for projects already in the planning and financing process stage by developers/builders, the company will implement the increased fee effective July 1, 2020. At that time the current \$725 URD fee will increase to \$1,000 per residential service point.

Criteria

The criteria is for the developer/builder to pay the underground line extension service point fee at the "reasonable and customary time" for the current phase(s) under construction defined by the following criteria:

- If a project has already been fully designed by Georgia Power, internal approval has been secured and developer/builder has been billed, the \$725 fee amount will apply.
- If a project has not already been fully designed by Georgia Power and internal approval not yet secured nor billed, then the fee amount for that project will generally be \$1,000 per service point.
- In order to provide enough time to design a typical project, a set of "design ready" plans need to be submitted to Georgia Power no later than June 1.
- Please check with your local engineer for specific project requirements and timeframes.

Design ready plans may include:

- Site Plan, Water Plan, Grading Plans, Existing Utilities, DOT Plans
- Erosion Control and Sedimentation Plans
- Notice of Intent (NOI)
- Electrical Load Data
