

102 new EV charging stations now at Hartsfield Jackson

Friday, Jan. 13, 2017 - On Thursday, Georgia Power joined with Hartsfield-Jackson Atlanta International Airport leaders, Mayor Kasim Reed and sustainability leaders from the City of Atlanta to unveil 102 electric vehicle charging stations.

The installation of the chargers is the first phase of a planned multi-stage EV charging program by the airport which may ultimately include 300 total EV charging station spots. The initiative is the most recent effort by the City of Atlanta and the Airport to turn Atlanta into one of the greenest airports in the world.

Georgia Power's role was to work with the Airport on the installation, including consultation on charging technology and connection to the electric grid.

"We are proud of our longstanding working partnership with Hartsfield-Jackson International Airport and we commend the Airport for its commitment to programs and services that promote sustainability," said Chairman, President & CEO Paul Bowers.

The EV charging stations are located at the following parking locations: North and South Domestic Terminal daily lots, South Employee lot, the Maynard H. Jackson International Terminal Hourly deck, the International Park-Ride deck, the ATL Technical Support Campus and Maintenance Building No. 1.

In addition to working with Hartsfield-Jackson to install the new EV chargers, other Georgia Power collaboration with the Airport includes the conversion of all of its hourly parking deck lighting to high quality, energy efficient LEDs, as well as all of the airfield and runway lights.
